To remind all registrants and potential registrants, our current and normal refund policy is:

Refund Policy:

- Refund Policy 50% of conference fee refunded if request is made in writing prior to September 7th, 2020 (Labour Day Monday)
- No refunds after September 7, 2020; and
- \$100 fee for name transfers

Should the COVID-19 pandemic prevent Best Defence 2020 from occurring, the following Refund Policy shall be applied:

- Your Registration will be applied toward Best Defence 2021 which will take place November 3-4, 2021; or
- If you prefer to cancel, we will **refund 85%** of the conference fees; and
- Sponsorships will be **refunded 100%**
